
KELLERBERRIN & DISTRICTS CLUB INC.

BY-LAWS



Revised December 2017

These By-laws are subject to revision and alteration at the discretion of the Management Committee. They are governed by and shall be read in conjunction with the Constitution of the Kellerberrin & Districts Club Inc.

1. CLUB REGULATIONS

1.1 CHITS

For the convenience of members, a chit system may be made available, through which members requiring credit can book up. The limit of such credit shall be fixed by the Manager and/or Committee.

Only Full Members may have access to chit facilities and approval of members requesting credit will be at the discretion of the Manager and/or Committee.

If Chits are not paid by the 15th of each month, credit will be suspended until the account is paid in full.

All further debt recovery to proceed as per Club Policy 1.6

1.2 CASHING OF CHEQUES

The Club may cash cheques up to \$150.00 subject to the Manager's discretion.

If a member's cheque is dishonoured, no more cheques can be accepted from that member, unless there are mitigating circumstances.

1.3 DISPUTES

All members must follow the Club Constitution and Policy Manual to handle any disputes with another member, staff or with the Management Committee of the Club.

1.4 POLICIES

The Committee has adopted a "Code of Conduct", "Management Plan", "House Management Plan" and "Members Code of Conduct" in conjunction with Clubs WA. These are displayed on the notice board within the Club.

1.5 LIQUOR ACCORD

The Kellerberrin & Districts Club Inc is associated with the Kellerberrin Liquor Accord and will abide by any decisions made through that Committee.

2. MEMBERSHIP REGULATIONS

2.1 FEES

Current club fees as at 1st July 2017 are: (inc GST)

Full Membership	\$55.00
Country Membership	\$27.50
Application Fee	\$11.00

If reapplying after an absence of less than two years, no application fee to be applied.

2.2 NON MEMBERS

Guests of members are permitted to enter the Club a maximum of 3 times per financial year before requiring to become a Member.

2.3 TEMPORARY MEMBERS

Persons who are a member or an official of, or a person assisting a visiting team based outside of the district of Kellerberrin, that is to contest a pre-arranged sport on that day, or at the invitation of a member, to engage in that sport on that day.

2.4 RECIPROCAL MEMBER

A current financial member of a like club with similar stated aims and objectives inside WA and any licensed club within Australia and New Zealand outside of WA may enter unaccompanied, 3 times per financial year.

2.5 MEMBER OF A SPORTING GROUP

A member of any Kellerberrin district based sporting club, but not a member of the Kellerberrin & Districts Club may enter the Kellerberrin & Districts Club on fixtured sports days but are prohibited from purchasing and consuming alcohol after their 3rd visit, as per Bylaw 2.2.

2.6 REFUSED MEMBERSHIP

A person who has been refused membership may not enter as a guest.

2.7 STAFF

Upon employment, all staff who are current members, shall have their membership rescinded and be granted Honorary Membership as per the Constitution. At cessation of employment, staff shall reapply for membership with no fee applicable.

2.8 CARERS

A registered carer, who is a non member, will be allowed to enter the club as many times as required, as long as the person they are caring for is a current financial member of the Club and is in the carer's company.

2.9 JUVENILES

Persons under 18 years of age will not be admitted as ordinary members.

Persons under 18 years of age are not permitted within one metre of the bar, unless in the designated juvenile service area.

Persons under 18 years of age are at all times to be under the direct control and supervision of parents, guardians or carers.

Persons under 18 years of age as a member of a sporting club are allowed access to the Club premises in the company of a designated adult member from the sporting club.

2.10 OPEN DAYS

The Club should at all times aim to utilize the 12 open days available to it under the Act to encourage new members and to showcase and promote the Club. These open days are those days that under the Act allows non members to utilize the facilities.
